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Last Month's Meeting

Dear Members,

Last month's general meeting featured a couple of notable highlights.

Trailblazer Leadership Award Presentation

GPCA presented the Trailblazer Leadership Award to Bob Teller in recognition of his outstanding leadership and commitment to developing and sustaining the Small Watershed Conservation Committee (SWCC).



Bob's vision and dedication were instrumental in the program's success. Key achievements under his leadership include:

- The formation of the SWCC as part of GPCA in September of 2017
- Organizing the first stream cleanup, involving approximately 40 community participants, including local schools and the Job Corps.



- Keeping the Stream Monitoring Program active and functional during the pandemic. Bob performed testing solo to ensure continuity, while continuing to manage monthly meetings, equipment logistics, and networking with Baltimore County and other organizations.

Stream Health and Water Quality Report Card

Also in last month's meeting guest speaker David Scheurer and SWCC committee members presented an extraordinary overview of the committee's technical work from 2020 through 2025.

The presentation documented monthly monitoring of Dogwood Run, Bens Run, Granite Run, and Brice Run, including the sampling and testing required to assess stream health. The session even featured a table tank of live stream critters.

Overall findings indicate that water quality parameters for these areas mostly fall within the normal or elevated range, reflecting good overall stream health. However, some streams showed atypical values that will require further study to determine potential causes and remediation strategies.

Status of Special Exception for Amar Khan Cemetery at 8523 Dogwood Road

The hearing originally scheduled for March 11 regarding the special exception request to permit a cemetery in the RC6 zone at 8523 Dogwood Road was cancelled on March 6. The applicant required additional time to fulfill the Baltimore County Department of Environmental Protection and Sustainability's requirements. Specifically, the department requested that the site plan clearly indicate the proposed burial areas, property boundaries, topography, water bodies, streams, soils, existing and proposed wells, perc tests, and sewage disposal areas on the subject property, as well as within 100 feet of the property line.

Once the revised site plan is completed to incorporate these details, it is expected that the petitioner will organize a meeting with the community, as advised by the Department of Planning. This meeting will provide an opportunity for community members to review the updated plans and ask questions about the proposed cemetery use.

Currently, the property is used for producing Halal farm products, such as goats, chickens, and eggs. In recent weeks, several residents in the area have encountered goats wandering onto their porches, doorsteps, and, most recently, three goats were seen roaming along Wrights Mill Road.

Further information regarding the hearing will be shared once the site plans are finalized and a date is set for the petition to be heard by the Administrative Law Judge.

A Brief History of the SWCC

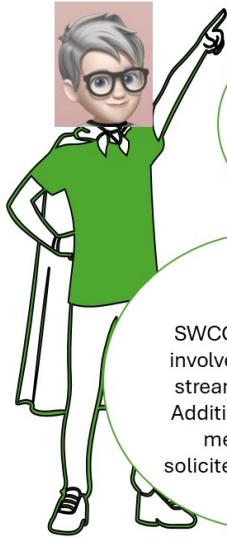
June 2017

The Baltimore County Department of Environmental Protection and Sustainability issued the final Small Watershed Action Plan (SWAP) Report for our area.

GPCA sets a goal of establishing a long-term volunteer sampling program within the GPCA area. The program will generate hard data to monitor and trend our area watershed health and to be used to predict the probable impact of zoning/land-use changes, infrastructure projects, etc.

To kick off the program, Bob Teller sends email to recruit volunteers for the Small Watershed Community Committee.

SWCC gets organized



Sept 2017

Official SWCC is formed as part of the GPCA

Nov 2017

First stream cleanup with approximately 40 participants from the community including Job Corps and schools collects 2,000+ pounds of trash

2018

SWCC is eager to get involved in monitoring stream water quality. Additional committee members were solicited and recruited.

SWCC designs a program of monitoring 4 streams with a high credibility level, following CMC standards.

Nov 2018

Second stream cleanup. Job Corps, PHG, high school students, and GPCA community members collected 2,500+ pounds of trash

SWCC Starts Stream Sampling

Jan-March 2019

Maps are studied to pick sampling sites. Parameters to be measured are selected. Instrumentation is selected. Bob readies his basement lab for stream sample testing!



Sept 2019

Stream sampling starts!

SWCC meets monthly. Monthly testing and data collection continues from here forward.



March 2020

The pandemic hits. Bob starts to perform testing **solo** in his basement and continues this through January 2025. Bob continued to hold monthly meetings, order supplies needed, and network with other organizations and Baltimore County.

SWCC Program continues to grow and mature

2021-2025

SWCC applies for and wins grants to fund supplies!

SWCC members continue to learn and interface with other organizations. Our data is shared with the CMC and the Izaak Walton League.

Members attend the annual Maryland Water Monitoring Conference.



SWCC members volunteer over 50 hours per month now.



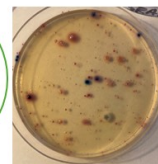

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District 10 Unity Night



Highlights of District 10 Unity Night By Gabriela Summerer-Herndon

On March 9th, I attended District 10 Unity Night in Annapolis as a

representative of GPCA. The evening brought together local officials and community members for meaningful conversation on issues that directly affect our neighborhood.

Below are the main highlights of the evening.

Woodstock Job Corps Site Update

Thanks to Delegate Jennifer White Holland, I had the opportunity to meet with **Atif Chaudhry, Secretary of the Department of General Services** — the state agency that oversees the Woodstock Job Corps Site.

Secretary Chaudhry shared that he recently conducted an in-person inspection of the site and found the building needing repairs due to federal neglect. Under the current arrangement, the federal government leases the property for \$1 per year over a 20-year term, with the condition that they maintain the building — a responsibility they have not met. General Services is now conducting a detailed assessment to document all needed repairs and hold the federal government accountable.

Importantly, **the lease expires this June** and will not be renewed unless the federal government provides a clear, stated purpose for the building's use. Secretary Chaudhry confirmed that any renewal will explicitly prohibit use of the facility as a detention center or similar purpose.

I emphasized that **GPCA is deeply concerned** about the site's future and would like to see it repurposed for community benefit — ideally as a job or workforce center. The Secretary committed to keeping us informed as developments unfold.

Baltimore County Police Department

Chief McCullough highlighted encouraging public safety news: **overall crime is down** for the second consecutive year, with a 20% reduction so far this year. He also expressed confidence that the department will be fully staffed by year's end. Chief McCullough additionally voiced his endorsement of Julian Jones for Baltimore County Executive.

Delegate Jennifer White Holland

Delegate White Holland is sponsoring several bills this session, with a particular focus on energy policy and immigration. One bill she is especially passionate about addresses **Perinatal Behavioral Health**

Conditions, which would expand mental health screenings during prenatal visits, at the six-week postpartum checkup, and at well-child visits throughout the first year after birth.

She is also backing an **ER staffing bill** — a pressing concern given that Maryland currently has the longest emergency room wait times in the nation.

Senator Benjamin Brooks

Senator Brooks now serves as **Chair of the Maryland Senate Executive Nominations Committee**, which reviews and makes recommendations on the governor's nominees for cabinet secretaries and other top appointments. He continues to champion energy affordability for Marylanders and among many others introduced legislation establishing an annual tax-free holiday on Veterans Day (November 11th). The bill — which passed the Senate unanimously — exempts items priced under \$2,000 from sales tax for eligible veterans, honoring their service in a tangible way.

Delegate N. Scott Phillips

Delegate Phillips serves as **Chair of the Legislative Black Caucus of Maryland** and sits on the House Judiciary Committee's civil law and public safety subcommittees. He is sponsoring several notable bills this session:

- **Maryland Transfer-on-Death Deed Act** — Would allow homeowners to transfer real property directly to a designated beneficiary upon death, bypassing the probate process.
- **Board of Public Works Procurement Oversight** — Would give the Board of Public Works authority over Department of Transportation and Maryland Transportation Authority contracts valued at \$500,000 or more. Currently, the MTA can spend its \$5+ billion budget without Board oversight.
- **Juvenile Justice Reform** — A bill close to Delegate Phillips' heart, this legislation would reduce the number of juveniles automatically charged as adults. Currently, 80% of such cases are eventually returned to juvenile court — but the process can take up to two years, during which young people are held in the adult system with no access to school or mental health services.

During the collaborative effort between Granite Presbyterian Church, American Legion Post 156 and St. Alphonsus Church the Blood Drive collected 23 units of blood where each pint of blood can positively affect 3 patients.

Through this blood drive alone 69 lives can potentially be saved. Additionally, the American Red Cross reports that this fiscal year, our blood drives have helped 126 lives, which they consider to be EXCELLENT.
