What's inside?

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President's Message

Snow in January postponed our annual election of officers and directors until our February 11 meeting (weather permitting!). Fortunately, guest speaker Sarah Smith, Randallstown Library Branch Manager, will reschedule for our April 11 meeting.

ForeFront Power, applicant for the solar facility at 9155 Old Court Road, has withdrawn their application to develop that project as well as the one proposed on Ridge Road. Construction of Alder Energy's facilities slated for Dogwood and Old Court Roads is expected to start in the spring for operation by August. Implementation of BGEs Community Solar Pilot Program in some of the rural areas is facing fierce opposition. District 3 Councilman Wade Kach introduced a bill proposing a 90-day moratorium on special exceptions for solar projects to allow time for consideration of recommendations from the Planning Board that include:

- Solar facilities should not be permitted on prime and productive soils.
- Solar facilities should be directed into business and manufacturing zones, brownfields, rooftops, and parking lots where financially feasible.
- Further indepth study of how other similar jurisdictions have responded to the use should be considered in a review of the current law.
- The feasibility of establishing locational criteria to determine appropriate siting of solar facilities should be investigated.
- Solar facilities should not be detrimental to scenic views or routes.
- Participation in future studies should be broadened to include stakeholders from each Councilmanic District.

More than 50 people testified at the County Council's January 15 public hearing, mostly in support of Councilman Kach's Solar Bill. Objections to the bill include delay of projects whose property owners have received special exceptions allowing the facilities, including the three in our community. The Council will vote on the bill at their January 22 session, just after this newsletter goes to print.

Immense gratitude goes to the gentleman and possibly others who have picked up hundreds of pounds of fast food containers, bottles, cans, cheap cigar boxes, car parts, tires, furniture, and just plain junk since Christmas from Johnnycake, Hollifield, and Old Frederick Roads. What motivates people to use the roadsides as a trashcan and dump is incomprehensible to me, but we deeply appreciate those who take up the challenge to pick it up and vastly improve our scenic views!

What are the GPCA boundaries anyway? GPCA's bylaws define them as:

- Patapsco River Marriottsville Road to Bens Run
- Old Court Road and side roads from Urban Rural Demarcation Line (URDL) to the Patapsco
- Hernwood Road and side roads
- Granite Road and side roads
- Offutt Road and side roads from Granite to Chapman Roads
- Davis Avenue and side roads
- Wrights Mill Road and side roads
- Dogwood Road from Old Court to Ridge
- All of Ridge Road and side roads
- Outside of URDLWindsor Mill Road east from Old Court to Ben's Run
- Outside of URDL from Windsor Mill Road west to Marriottsville Road

And did you know there are two levels of GPCA membership determined by the boundaries? A regular membership is extended to those residing within the boundaries and an associate membership is available to anyone living outside these boundaries. Only regular members can vote at meetings.

Whether you're in or outside of our boundaries, I hope you'll attend our February 11 meeting to learn about stream monitoring from Baltimore County's water monitoring supervisor, Dr. Kevin Brittingham. Thanks GPCA's Small Watershed Community Committee (SWCC) chair, Bob Teller for scheduling this presentation.

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SWCC Builds Water Monitoring Program

GPCA's Small Watershed Community Committee (SWCC) hosted Tammy Domanski, Associate Professor of Biology at Anne Arundel Community College at our January meeting, to discuss establishing a volunteer water quality monitoring program, a SWCC goal. Tammy addressed two primary considerations when establishing a program:

- Administration of the program to report data collected
- Logisitics of collecting the data.

What to test for, where to test, frequency of testing, and how to test must be addressed to insure meaningful results. SWCC's initial goal for testing is to establish a baseline assessment for our local watersheds. Determining what to test for may be influenced by known impacts on our streams, the golf courses on Ridge Road are within the Dogwood Run and Ben's Run watersheds, storm water runoff from storm drains inside the URDL especially in Ben's Run, the lumber mill and cemetery in the Brice's Run watershed, and farms, mainly in the Brice's Run and Mardella Run watersheds.

Given those features within the community, Tammy suggested testing for nitrogen, phosphorus, and ammonia. She also recommends using the parameters of Baltimore County's Small Watershed Action Plan (SWAP) so results can be compared. She advises that testing must be consistent. If we're testing in all four of these streams, testing should occur on the same day, as close to the same time as possible to reduce the impact of variable conditions. such as temperature and rainfall on our results. Testing should be performed at the same location in the streams each time. Tammy recommends testing a minimum of monthly, but twice a month is preferred. She described various tools for testing ranging from relatively inexpensive kits requiring chemicals which have to be replenished, to higher end, more reliable test equipment using a probe that records data electronically and can be uploaded to a computer. greatly simplifying recording and reporting results.
