### From the Editor's Desk

I have always harbored a special admiration for bamboo. Patches of green bamboo groves dotted the countryside where I grew up. I loved the crisp bright green color of the bamboo leaves in the Spring and I was always enchanted by the graceful swaying of the bamboo canes in the gentle breeze. Because of its grace, strength and indomitable growing power, bamboo is often featured in Chinese ancient paintings and poems as its character exemplified the great virtues of a noble gentleman in Chinese culture.

Sadly, upon being transplanted in North America, bamboo's firm and indominable growth characteristics have earned it the notorious label as "Invasive" species. As a fellow transplant myself, I do declare my love of bamboo has not been diminished by its tainted reputation on our shores.

Members of the GPCA Small Watershed Committee (SWCC) organized an invasive bamboo clearing on October 1<sup>st</sup>. Patrik and I joined the effort on early Sunday morning. We happily (ahem, those who had to carry and load the cumbersome bamboo canes may disagree!) took a truckload of my beloved bamboo canes home. The secret of controlling bamboo growth is to remove the shoots and thin the canes regularly. Bamboo has a wide range of potential uses in our daily lives. Bamboo shoots are edible (not all species, just ask panda bears), bamboo leaves are used in many ways in Asian cuisine. Bamboo canes can be made into cups, holders, fences, garden stakes, and furniture. Bamboo pulp can be processed to make paper and textiles for clothing. I look forward to using these bamboo canes for my climbing

cucumber and bean plants in my vegetable garden next year.

A portion of the bamboo canes we cleared out are left at the pull-out area opposite Edrich Saw Mill. Please feel free to take them home and use them before the County pick them up. I hope you will also grow to appreciate bamboo and admire its grace and strength and make good use of its indominable growth.

#### **GPCA Needs YOU**



GPCA By-Laws direct us to hold annual elections at our January general meeting. To be eligible to serve on the Executive Board candidates must be members of GPCA for a minimum of 6 months immediately preceding the election.

Officers are elected for a one year term. The president may serve for 2 consecutive one year terms and may again become eligible after a one year lapse. Directors serve for 3 year terms and may again become eligible after a one year lapse. This election cycle Director Lisa Charzsyn's 3 year term expires creating a vacancy for that office. There are no term limits for other officers.

What's the commitment? In addition to attending GPCA's General Meetings on the 2nds Monday September to June the Board meets on the 3rd Monday of each month at 7:00 pm via Zoom. All Officers and Directors shall contribute impartially to decisions of the board and support the objectives of GPCA which per our By-Laws are:

"To preserve and enhance the tranquility and beauty of our rural environment and to encourage orderly and positive growth of the community within the framework of prescribed regulations and laws. The Association shall provide a forum for all residents to express their concerns and interests and shall attempt to provide informative and interesting programs that will keep members informed and better able to address any of their concerns or problems. The Association's objective is also to foster a spirit of community among the residents."

Nominations of candidates are being taken at this time and will continue until the election when nominations will be taken from the floor (even the virtual floor). 
### **Lanternflies - An Alternate View**

#### FOR THE LOVE OF INSECTS

STOP SQUISHING SPOTTED LANTERNFLIES

They're not the monsters they were once made out to be, and stepping on them isn't effective. So why are people still unleashing their fury on spotted lanternflies, and what should we be doing instead?

Spotted lanternflies have not lived up to their foreshadowed reputation. In early 2022, Penn State published an <u>article dispelling the myths</u> that had grown up around them, advising readers that lanternflies rarely kill trees. In August, researchers there published results showing that so far, the <u>insects have not caused nearly as much damage to hardwood trees</u> as once feared. " ... [I]n a natural setting where the insects are constantly on the move," they wrote, "we would not expect significant negative impacts on forest or ornamental trees." Other entomologists and ecologists have admitted as much too, yet in a recent <u>New York Times piece</u>, they still defended their mass-squishing campaigns. Cornell University entomologist Daniel Gilrein noted there was scant evidence that stomping would reduce populations in any significant way, wrote *Times* reporter Claire Fahy, "but he noted that the communal effort 'helps

engage the public' and leads people to feel 'somewhat empowered.' "

Serenity Ridge Natural Burial Cemetery & Arboretum Wildflower Planting and Invasive Plant Removal



June 10th, 2023

Back in June, several members of the Greater Patapsco Community Association (GPCA) and broader Baltimore County community assisted with an environmental stewardship event in partnership with Patapsco Heritage Greenway and Serenity Ridge Natural Burial Cemetery and Arboretum. The natural burial cemetery is the first of its kind in the state and opened in December. It is located in Windsor Mill, a neighborhood of the GPCA.

Together, <u>18 volunteers contributed a total of 54 hours</u> on Saturday, June 10th. Participants assisted with two projects: 1) installing a native wildflower garden at the front of the cemetery for families to cut fresh flowers for graves of loved ones, and 2) removal of invasive plants farther back on the property along the entrance to new trailheads for visitors.



The cemetery is free and open to the public Monday through Friday from 9am-5pm. With help from volunteers, this family-owned natural burial site hopes to be a place where community members can enjoy the tranquility of its 80+ acres through rolling meadows, woods, wildflower gardens, and hiking trails.

Getting to this point was not an easy task, as volunteers can attest from the June 10th event. Removing invasive plants is a challenge. These species overwhelm habitat and take over native species. While individual plants may be easy to pull and uproot, the collective number of plants is a task for an army. With the dedication of volunteers, slowly but surely we will provide more sunlight, space, and habitat for native plants to thrive.

The soil where the group installed the wildflower garden was riddled with rocks and gravel, likely remnants from former uses of the site. Thanks to Bob Teller and his gas-powered tiller, we were able to soften the earth in preparation for seed. After clearing weeds, rocks, and turning over as much of the first layer of soil as possible, volunteers spread a mix of native wildflower seed and covered the seed with compost and straw to promote growth and prevent seed from blowing away. The garden was watered a couple days later with the help of mother nature.

Patapsco Heritage Greenway staff recently visited Serenity Ridge to check on these projects. As with all invasive species, they require constant management and mitigation. Much to our surprise, the wildflower garden is flourishing (See picture on the top of this article)!. All who attended the initial event were skeptical if the seed would be able to take root in such compact soil, but nature prevailed. Our sincere thanks to everyone involved in this effort on a very hot, summer day!

PHG will be assisting with more stewardship efforts at Serenity Ridge this upcoming fall and spring. You can find a list of volunteer opportunities, to include events at Serenity Ridge, on the Patapsco Heritage Greenway website calendar or Eventbrite page.

## Granite Historical Society Fall Hike

The Granite Historical Society is planning a Fall Hike on Sunday, October 22<sup>nd</sup>. We will meet in the parking lot of the Granite Presbyterian Church at 1PM. We've applied for permission with DNR to park cars inside the access gate at Alberton Rd and then we'll walk along

the Alberton Road Trail to the Daniels Dam, a distance of about a mile and a half. This is the last remaining dam on the Main Falls of the Patapsco. Along the way we'll visit the Upton house, a really neat historic stone and frame house built by Joshua Upton in 1851. We'll also visit the ruins and graveyard of St Stanislaus Church, a mission church established by the Woodstock College Jesuits in the 1870s. Unfortunately, the church was struck by lightning and burned in 1926 and never replaced.
